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
Walking Dead to the Young and Restless

But putting the human person at the centre of their meetings and deliberations is precisely what Jesus Christ did 2000 years ago and what Pope Francis tirelessly advocates today. We do need rules and regulations and traditions for a harmonious life. The litmus test of how we love and serve is when we put the person at the centre of vision in serving God.



SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

Although we have only one **Iesuit Brother in maintenance** and one Jesuit priest on staff, there has been an almost weekly request for Spiritual direction. This is a one-to-one conversation about spiritual matters as we journey into a great intimacy with God. It is not so much an exercise in discernment e.g. Do I have a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, to married life? Should I change my whole lifestyle? Should I leave all and go and help in a third world country? Rather like the young man in the Gospel, the quest is what should I do


to deepen my intimacy with the Lord?

Mike Hyland, one of our retreat captains who has had a four-year spirituality course at Regis, (Jesuit College) is coordinating these requests.



JESUIT VOLUNTEERS CANADA

At the last weekend in April, the Jesuit Volunteers Canada (JVC) Board came to Manresa. They spent this time to pray, reflect on, and share JVC experiences from the past year. They discerned actions and strategies to move forward. It was a time of deep thought, a lot of laughter and a bonding of men and women in the service of Christ as seen in people and places around us.

JVC is a formation program rooted in Ignatian spirituality that seeks to develop young men and women to be life-long builders of the Kingdom of God. It is a one to two year immersion service experience where volunteers work full-time in serving and learning from those living on the margins. The broader experience of Jesuit Volunteers is living in community. Here they are engaged in growing spiritually. They participate in ongoing social and eco justice educational events.

This year, JVC has had 3 volunteers working

- with *Canadian Jesuits International* which is a Jesuit apostolate
- Becoming Neighbours, a program that matches immigrants and refugees with Christians communities that help them
- Seeds of Hope, an organization that creates transitional homes, safe places, and creative spaces for homeless individuals in Toronto.
